\* On 9/1/2007 MIA received a payment from the "Copyright Clearance Center" for an incorrect licensing payment for a so-called copyrighted work. While the work is public domain, and while the collection of royalties is antithetical to the mission of MIA, the CCC had no mechanism to return the mistaken payment. MIA unanimously moved that we could not accept this money, and while we did not know the exact origin of the incorrect payment, we knew it came from Australia. As a result, the money was sent to Charles Sturt University in New South Wales Australia, which runs a radical education program for young women in the Australian outback. The money will be dispersed over seven years to the most outstanding student in *Politics of Identity* in the form of an Alexandra Kollantai Prize.

\*\* These errors represent two issues: (1) A scam company made some false charges that our bank could not rescind; (2) Accidental use of the MIA debit card for non-MIA expenses. This second error was remedied through an offsetting donation by the volunteer who made the mistake.
