Split over pay deal cannot be healed

THE deepening split in the trade union movement over the 4½ per cent pay deal cannot be healed.

On the one hand, millions of workers are being driven into conflict with the Labour government's wage-cutting proposals.

Prices are going up faster than ever

— April's 1.9p-in-the-pound increase
was three times the March increase
and the highest for nearly a year.

Food prices — which will shortly show the effects of the record 10 per cent devaluation of sterling in March — are soaring up. So are rents, fuel bills and fares.

This means that opposition to the

pay laws must grow.

In the giant Transport and General Workers' Union, the biggest region, no. 1, revolted against Jack Jones and declared their opposition. The film workers' union, the white collar union ASTMS and other conferences have

already gone on record to fight the 41/2 per cent deal.

The opposition is being led by the miners. South Wales miners' representaives voted by 138 to 12 against the pay laws. 'I am certain the rank-and-file miner will reject the new policy as ridiculous', stated South Wales NUM president Emlyn Williams.

On the other hand, union leaders both 'left' and 'right' are falling over themselves to accept the deal.

-Engineers' president Hugh Scanlon threatened to resign from the TUC negotiating team if his union threw out the pay deal.

'We will not indulge in irresponsible action which can only result in the now minority Labour government being brought down', he said. He is, of course, speaking for himself.

The international bankers, the capitalist class and the millionaires control the Labour government and trades union leaders like puppets.

A team from the International Monetary Fund started looking over bankrupt Britain's accounts in Whitehall last week. They will doubtless demand more attacks on living standards, the smashing of the unions and the decimation of public spending.

Just to keep the terrified reformists on their toes, the City of London dropped the £ sterling below the \$1.80 mark—its lowest ever—last week.

These ruthless profiteers are being driven on by the greatest economic crisis in their history to smash the working class and its living standards. They are using the Labour government to assist them.

(The Financial Times made this clear when they compared Callaghan to a 'Tory prime minister' recently).

Every moment that this rotten bunch of traitors stays in office they will be preparing new attacks on workers' jobs, living standards, and basic democratic rights. Why should the working class put up with this? Led by the miners, they booted out the Tory government in

Why should the same treatment not be given to this anti-socialist bunch of impostors?

To suggest that the existence of the Labour government is advancing the struggle of the trade unions, as Scanlon does, disarms the working class movement.

The YS repeat once again: This Labour government must be forced out of office by the full strength of the working class.

That is the way the bankers' and monopolists' bluff can be called. That is the way a new General Election can be prepared, in which the Tories can be soundly beaten, and the Labour Party brought to power, not with Tory policies but with a full socialist programme.

Union dilemma of Language Assistants

THE language assistant is placed in a most difficult position in school: is he a student, a teacher or a student-teacher?

This precarious status raises the problem of belonging to a union. Should the assistant joint the National Union of Teachers or the National Union of Students? Obviously he will not be able to join the NUS if he does not attend College, and this is the case of many an assistant in Great Britain.

S On the other hand, it is

doubtful whether he is eligible to join the NUT since he is not a qualified teacher, and he will find himself in the uncomfortable position where he is not backed by any union in his fight for his rights.

We will find an example of this in the London Weighting problem.

This substantial allowance added to the annual salary is paid to all teaching staff and civil servants in London. The assistants are facing the same problems of increasing rents, and the rising cost of public transport, as other employees. And yet, they receive exactly the same amount of money as an assistant in a small northern town, for instance.

We have the right to get the London Weighting, and this SW40JT

injustice should not exist any

It is in our interest to get together, in order to fight for our own rights.

Assistants are directly concerned with the educational cuts problem. The number of language assistants is going to be largely reduced within the next few years.

As it is absolutely vital for our fellow students to have the oppor y of going abroad as langue assistants, it is our task to right for them, and fight the cuts.

How much profit are they making?

I AM a YS member from Clapham. I was working from 8.00 a.m. until 4.45 p.m. for five days a week in a leather factory, making suitcases, which was quite a skilled job.

The wage I was getting was only £26. You might think that this was good money, but I was making suitcases of good quality leather, and I can make about 200 suitcases in a fortnight, which would sell for £15 each.

When I thought of how much profit the bosses were making out of me I left the job.

From working in this factory I could see I was getting nowhere.

Listening to other workers sitting next to me, working for years, they told me it was not worth working there. After working there for many weeks I realized they were right.

This is one of the reasons why the bosses are where they are, through exploitation. This verymoment thousands of youth must be in same situation.

18 ARRESTS AS POLICE BATTLE 200 YOUTH

POLICE arrested 18 black youth in a confrontation outside the New River Sports Centre, Tottenham, last Wednesday.

Police squad cars swooped on a crowd of over 200 youth who were leaving the Centre after a Haringey Schools sports meeting. According to local residents, the arrests provoked a pitched battle.

Some youth were later released, but nine teenagers — including two girls — were released on bail to appear at Tottenham Magistrates Court on June 11th.

They were charged with offences including possessing offensive weapons, assault on police, threatening behaviour and wilful obstruction.

The two girls were accused of threatening behaviour and causing criminal damage.

Nine juveniles — four girls and five boys — aged between 14 and 16 were reported to the Police Juvenile Bureau accused of threatening behaviour, obstructing the police and insulting behaviour.

There were more incidents at Wood Green police station involving youth who were not outside the Sports Centre.

The police said that ten officers had to have medical treatment after the incident—but only three had even 'slight' injuries. According to the park-keeper, one policeman was 'trodden on'.

Youth in jail

'WE no longer have youngsters down the mines or climbing chimney stacks, but we still have some 3,000 juveniles a year kept in prison or remand', the annual conference of Probationary Officers was told last week.

Speaking as chairman of their parliamentary committee Mr David Mathieson bitterly attacked the government for refusing to act on the issue.

OXFORD POLY AXED STUDENTS at BY CUTS

Oxford Polytechnic face massive cuts in their courses next year.

Over 200 part time lecturers at the Polytechnic will lose their jobs at the end of the present term as part of the continuing clampdown on education spending.

The leadership of the Student. Union, composed of Tories and right-wing Labourites have accepted the cuts.

A leaflet put out by them, signed by the Treasurer and Deputy-President-elect of the Union, applauded the programme of cut-backs and 'wage-restraint'. It claimed that these policies represent 'a solution to our economic ills which can already be seen to be working'.

JOBS DISASTER FACES SCHOOL DISASTER faces thousands of this year's LEAVERS school leavers. There have never been so few vacancies, so few

apprenticeships, so many of last year's leavers already on the dole, such hopeless prospects.

In the London area, once renowned for tiny unemployment figures, it is forecast that one in four school leavers will be jobless next

Of the 20,000 youth leaving Inner London Education Authority Schools, it is expected that at least 5,000 will join 2,000 of last year's leavers who have never found work.

The panic scramble for jobs has already started. London Transport's Acton Training Centre got 2,000 applications for 135 apprenticeships — double what they received last year.

An LT spokesman commented that this would 'raise the entry standard'. That's a lot of use to the 1,865 unlucky ones.

'As job prospects worsen, even those with good exam results face a tough search for work', says the London 'Evening Standard'. It adds that 'the immediate future is grim' for un-qualified leavers.

Teachers have given up the line: 'Work hard and you will get a better job'. Pupils are being told to grab the first vacancy they can and hang on to it for dear life.

Alternative

The alternative is £7.70 social security money and a life tramping the streets. Or perhaps working on a 'job creation scheme' digging parks. or cleaning waste.

Ashley Bramall, ILEA Labour chief, will announce on Monday 'Standard'. Those weak in basic skill will get reading, writing and arithmetic lessons

Others will go through courses on industrial relations liberal studies and technical subjects supposedly to improve their jobs chances.

These 'Emergency Measures' are a total fraud. All they show is that the Labour leaders - at government or local level could not give a damn about school-leavers or their future.

Increase

Firstly: What is the use of teaching youth who can't get jobs 'industrial relations' or liberal studies?

This will not cause an increase in vacancies. It will not stop the general decline in production and cutting-back of work-forces.

Secondly. Where on earth does Mr Bramall think the money will come from to keep hundreds of extra teenagers at school?

He must know that the ILEA. like all education authorities in Britain, is cutting back on equipment, staff and buildings. He must know that further cuts are being called for. He must know that 8,000 teachers are out of work because no school has any money to pay them.

In any case, the reason for the massive upsurge of youth unemployment is the deep economic crisis of capitalism.

The world slump means that every major firm is taking on

who control it can't make money out of you, they will sling you on the scrap-heap.

We have our own set of emergency measures to deal with youth unemployment.

1. Mobilize the working class and trade union movement to force this rotten Labour government to resign.

2. Call an emergency Labour Party conference, decide on socialist policies of nationalizing



the banks, land and industry under workers' control and fight the next General Election on these policies.

3. Build the revolutionary party to prepare to take the working class to power and put end to this crisis-ridden system. Only then will young people control their own lives instead of having them determined by the profit calculations of the exploiters.

THERE is something sick in a society which makes its school leavers face the bleak outlook on the dole', says Hugh Scanlon, AUEW president.

Mr Scanlon is now spending his time selling the new wage-cutting pay deal worked out between the trades union leaders and the Labour government.

The policies of the Labour government, in line with the requirements of big business are to drive unemployment up in line with the attack on living standards.

morning 'Emergency Measures' to deal with this serious threat to thousands of youth.

The iLEA Education Committee rubber-s'amped the plan last Tuesday.

Headmasters will be told to urge 16-year olds to stay on for further study, or go to Further Education college to 'keep themselves occupied'.

Special college courses have been planned, says the fewer workers. It has already driven unemployment up to over 1.3 million for the first time

since the war. The British government is bankrupt and the slashing of public spending means even fewer jobs are available.

CLAPHAM SCHOOL LEAVERS TALK TO 'YS'

'Prospects: I haven't got any, have I?'

'Young Socialist' interviewed Kenny and Robert who leave Henry Thornton school, Clapham Common, on May 28

'I leave school at the end of next week,' said Kenny. 'Prospects — I haven't got any, have 1?

'Well, I've got a couple of interviews but I doubt if they will get me very far.

'I am looking for work in carpentry — joinery, building work.

'I have had an interview with the GLC but out of 40 who got an interview they will only take 8 or 10. That's for the whole of London.

Usually

'The careers office just ask you what you want to do. Usually they try and talk you into doing something else.

'They gave me a couple of

companies' names to write to but they never even gave me the addresses.

'They tried to push me into wood machining which is a totally different trade. All you do in wood machining is feed wood into sawing machines and so on.

'The other thing they tell you is "Don't worry you can always come back to school." That is if you can't get a job or can't make up your mind what you want to do."

Kenny saw not purpose in going through more school which would not improve his chances. 'I won't be coming back — things will be even worse than they are now in a year', he said.

'I want to get out now — even though there's not much chance of getting the job that I want.

'I won't get any dole and you have to accept the jobs they offer you, no matter how bad, if you're on social security.'

Kenny pointed out that there was only one kind of work which did seem short of employees. They have all sorts of people coming into the school plugging the army, the navy and the police.

'We wouldn't join them'

Robert said: 'I have written to 15 different firms. They have all written back saying "Sorry, this year's vacancies are all taken, we will contact you if the situation changes."

Robert pointed out that soaring youth unemployment means low wages.

'There's very little going. A friend of ours was so desperate for work that he took a job as a garage mechanic for which he gets 22p an hour.

'That's about £11 a week he'd get more money on the

FOR SOUTH LONDON YOUTH

or 4,100 leavers

OVER 4000 youth in Wandsworth, South London, will leave school between now and July. On April 9 the careers officers had 94 jobs for them.

Two and a half thousand jobs have been lost in Wandsworth over the last two years. The only new jobs in the area are now office jobs.

Apprenticeships are virtually non-existent.

For a job as a nurse or a physiotherapist several hundred girls compete. For an engineering or building apprenticeship there are a similar number of applicants.

In the hardest-hit area, Battersea, unemployment has risen from the September 1975 figure of 2937 to 3565 this January.

At Battersea North employment exchange, they have ended the system whereby a claimant has to prove that he is looking for work after a month on the dole.

This is an open admission by the authorities that there are no

The much publicised job schemes will have little or no effect on youth unemployment in Battersea.

Wandsworth Council plans a 'community industry scheme' but this will provide a maximum of 50 jobs, digging gardens and washing windows — for 4100 school leavers.

The borough will be employing apprentices in the public works department, training in building rades, but

this will provide a laughable total of twenty-five jobs.

Wandsworth Borough's great scheme to employ youth turning stretches of the river Wandle into a canoeist's paradise met a sticky end.

The river was found to be an open sewer!

The 'Sunspot' amusement arcade in St John's Hill, Battersea, is so

crowded with unemployed youth, that the bingo hall has been cut in half and pool tables have been brought in instead.

Because of the number of unemployed youth on the streets all week, Wandsworth Council wanted Battersea youth workers to open their clubs during the day.

There were only two snags.

Not one penny was to be provided for the youth workers' wages or for anything else;
 The council did not want

youth activities laid on — they wanted role playing.

Role playing? It's quite simple really.

The youth club leader has to play boss and you play the

applicant for a job.

The mind boggles.

The youth workers, whilst anxious to lay on facilities for the unemployed, were not prepared to start up a farce like that for no pay.

In any case the reason why

youth could not get jobs, was not because they did not know how to behave at an interview, but that there were no jobs available, the social workers said.

HOME working by women and young girls has increased staggeringly. Exploitation rates of a couple of pence per skirt or blouse are paid. Total earnings of £6 or £7 are common.

Shops full of sewing machines for home working are now a common sight in Battersea.

Housing in the area is also deteriorating — the Doddington estate, parts of which can only be compared to Alcatraz, was built below the flood level.

Consequently it suffers from flooding and also from back flow in the sewers into surks and bathrooms, because the pipes used were too small.



2,000 march through London

LONG ARAB REVOLUTION!



SLOGANS on the demonstration were: 'Free Palestine! Down with Zionism!' Young Socialists shouts of 'Long live the Arab revolution! Forward to the world revolution! Victory to the PLO!' were taken up by many marchers.

OVER 2,000 Arab workers and students marched through London last Sunday demanding a free, democratic, secular state of Palestine.

They called on workers everywhere to unite against Zionism and imperialism. They emphasized the need for an armed struggle to free Palestine.

A meeting at Hyde Park was addressed by speakers from the Arab and British labour movement, and by representatives of Iranian, Pakistani, Chilean, Cypriot, Yemeni and Jewish student organisations.

Hussam Alrawy, president of the General Union of Arab Students, condemned the state of Israel as a racist regime this was made clear in the recent repression on the West

At the same time as the Israeli army was killing Palestinian people, Vorster, the South African Prime Minister. was in the country shopping for

This is why we say that the struggle of the Palestinian people is the same as the struggle of the people of South Africa and Zimbabwe.

Speech

Greetings from the Young Socialists and Workers Revolutionary Party, brought by YS national secretary Simon Pirani, were warmly applauded and his speech was interrupted several times by cheering and chanting.

A loud cheer went up when he condemned the Syrian troops in the Lebanon and warned that: They will attempt to impose peace' at the cost of thousands of Palestinian lives.

He pledged that the YS and WRP would carry out their

pledge of solidarity by building the revolutionary party to smash capitalism in Britain.

Some of the young marchers told 'Young Socialist' why they were calling for a free Palestine.

Mohsen (18) from Brooklyn Technical College, Birmingham, said: The Labour government are capitalist. They will always be against the rights of the Palestinian people.

Samia (19), a student at Imperial College, London, said: We are marching to tell the people of the world that there is a nation without a home. They are living in tents and caravans.

We want to get our land back'

A 15-year old Egyptian student said: 'In Lebanon it is a question not of Christian and Islam but left-wing and right-wing.

The left wing are the M majority - the right is represented by the Christian president."

Referring to the Arab leaders who have betrayed the Palestine struggle, she said: 'I think every one of them is a bastard and I only have faith in one of them -Gaddafi of Libya, who has not accepted any compromise with Israel and believes in the destruction of the state of

A.A. Hussein, a student at the University of Sheffield, said: 'I support very strongly the people southern Africa who are fighting racism. The revolution has started there and the youth are the nucleus of it.

IMPERIALISM has always denied the Palestinian people the right to live and work in their own country, to national self-determination.

Arab workers and students protested in London, and all over the world, last weekend, to commemorate the setting-up of the state of Israel 28 years ago.

The British government's Balfour Declaration, in 1917, opened the way for the establishment of the State of Israel on May 14 1948, carved out of the Palestinian Arab homeland.

The imperialists have any concern to help the Jewish people, but in order to have a base against the Arab revolution. Zionist colonisers drove half a million Palestinians from their homeland in 1948, massacred villagers and seized

When the war was over the Arab nations - except for Colonel Gaddaffi's Libya supported the treacherous United Nations resolution 242.

In the 1973 oil war the Ara armies regained large section of the invaded territory. All th might of the oil-producing state such as Saudi Arabia and Egy was brought to bear again

Killing on the West Bank

17-YEAR-OLD - Lina Nabulsi died of two bullet wounds during a riot like the one in this picture.

Lina, the eighth Arab and first girl to die in the anti-Zionist riots in the occupied West Bank of the Jordan, was chased into an apartment by a soldier while hundreds of youth were stoning the Israeli forces.

Relatives said she was highly intelligent, a nationalist, and

had returned from a visit to London only a few days ago.

Israeli officials said that Lina was killed by a 'ricochet' bullet — but a soldier is being questioned.

A local merchant, Sayed Ali Masri, told reporters he was threatened with shooting 'If I did not shut up', when he spoke to soldiers about Lina's death.

Hundreds of young Arabs demonstrated outside the home of the dead girl last week shouting 'Palestine is Arab' and 'Killers'. Two were injured by gunfire when Israeli troops dispersed the crowd.

Lina Nabulsi died because she fought against the Zionist occupation of her homeland.

The past few weeks have seen mass demonstrations and riots throughout the West Bank against Israeli occupation.

Every life sacrificed will make young people there more determined to fight to the end.

The Lebanon is the latest flashpoint of struggle in the Middle East.

The civil war has already claimed 20,000 lives.

It is not a war between Christians and Muslims as the western Press make out.

The CIA-backed Falange

dictatorship of Suleman Franjeh has begun a policy of slaughter against not only the thousands of Palestinians who have been driven from their homeland into Lebanese refugee camps, but against Lebanese Arabs as well.

The Falange has attempted to divide and rule by turning a large minority of Christians (over one third of the population) against the Arab workers and peasants.

The Syrian regime has shown their true colours in the Lebanon. A force of 16,000 Syrian-officered Al Saiqa and Syrian regular troops invaded the Lebanon last month, supposedly to bring the two sides to a settlement.

The Syrian intervention has been backed 100 per cent by the United States, Russia and the Israeli Zionists. The Israeli premier boasted last week that the Syrians had killed more Palestinian guerrillas than the Israelis had ever been able to

Now banker Elias Sarkis has been appointed Lebanese president with full Syrian backing — and their armies have been turned against left-wing workers and the Palestine commandos.

Statements

Syria and the United States can only impose a 'peace' settlement in Lebanon in one way, by drowning the Palestinian people in blood.

Last year, American imperialist leaders made it

clear in a series of aggressive statements that they were prepared for a nuclear showdown in the Middle East.

They armed Israel with the H-bomb.

Today they are doing their utmost to use the Arab bourgeois leaders as a battering-ram against the Palestine struggle.

Detente

In line with the world-wide policy of 'detente' the Soviet leaders support this policy.

The Young Socialists believe that no amount of wheeling and dealing by the treacherous nationalists, the imperialists and the Stalinists can defeat the Palestine liberation struggle.

The Palestinian people are fighting because they have their country to win and nothing to lose. They have shown the same steel determination which smashed American imperialism in Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos and Angola.

We say no deals should be made with imperialism. No confidence should be placed in the Arab bourgeoisie. The workers and peasants can and must win a socialist, democratic, secular Palestinian state.

The greatest assistance that the Young Socialists can give to that struggle is not in words. It is in building the revolutionary party in Britain to smash this rotten capitalist regime which has always backed imperialism and Zionism to the hilt.

ULRIKE MEINHOF, a leader of the West G e r m a n B a a der-Meinhof anarchist group, was found hanged in her solitary prison cell in Stuttgart where she was held for four years.

It was Sunday May 8th the anniversary of the defeat of Nazism on May 8th, 1945.

The Justice Ministry originally stated that Meinhof committed suicide, hanging herself by tying a strip of towelling to the window frame.

Her body was discovered by prison warders at 7.34 a.m. on May 9th.

There are some extremely odd circumstances surrounding her death which have led thousands of Germans to ask: Did she really commit suicide?

 The ministry statement on her suicide was released at 7.38 a.m.
 four minutes after her body was discovered.

 There was no window frame from which she was supposed to have rigged the neck-breaking towelling — and the grating would have been far too narrow for such towelling to be threaded through it.

 There was another puzzling aspect to the death. Each of the four Baader-Meinhof defendants had to remove the only light-bulb from their cells and hand it to the warder each night before retiring.

Blouse

But when Meinhof's cell was opened on Monday in the presence of a lawyer, the light bulb was still there.

 When she was found in the morning, she was wearing a new blouse and not the one she had been seen with on the day of her death.

 Defence lawyers could not get hold of Meinhof's body until 48 hours after her death, by which

time it was too late to conduct a post-mortem to reveal anything.

Meinhof's co-defendant Gudrun Ensslin says she spoke to Meinhof about 10 p.m. on Saturday night through the cell windows and she seemed quite normal.

Her sister said that she had told her she would never commit suicide.

West German poet and writer Erich Fried said that the Baader-Meinhof trial was being staged under Nazi-like conditions.

The government has spent millions to erect a fortress court at Stammheim for a show trial.

It is under constant army and police surveillance and everyone going in and out — judges and lawyers included — are physically and electronically searched.

Isolation

Meinhof has spent most of the past four years in isolation and under constant harassment by prison officials.

At one time it was suggested that she undergo brain surgery to 'cure' her 'anti-social' behaviour.

Last weekend she was buried in West Berlin amid scenes of extraordinary emotion and tension.

More than 4.000 sympathisers went to the cemetery to mourn her death, while more than double that number of police stood in the background.

Many mourners wore masks or painted their faces to confuse political police taking photographs.

They carried posters vowing to avenge her death.
