DEAR SIR: The Twenty-fourth annual convention of the American Federation of Labor will be held at Lyric Hall, San Prancisco, Cal., beginning Monday, November 14th, and will continue in session from day to day until the business of the convention has been completed, which will be from ten days to two weeks.

In accordance with our usual custom we will have several delegates at this convention and are in position to furnish you with a full and complete report of the entire proceedings, including all secret sessions. This convention will consider and act upon matters of vast importance and seriously effecting the railroad, manufacturing and employing interests of this country, including contemplated labor legislation both in congress and the several states, pending strikes, boycotts and lockouts, as well as other matters affecting the labor interests of the entire country, and we have no doubt that this information will be of great interest and value to you.

These reports will be furnished from time to time as the convention proceeds and will give you full and detailed information concerning all action taken.

For your information we would state that the American Federation of Labor now has in the field 1,175 commissioned organizers, and the number of affiliated unions on August 1st, 1904, was as follows:

Giving the American Pederation of Labor a total membership of over 1,500,000, and cash in the treasury August 1st available for defense and organization purposes amounting to \$88,188.01. During July, 1904, the Federation spent \$20,342.98 chiefly for organization and strike


