# HUEY'S STATEMENT

### ON STOP THE DRAFT WEEK

Statement of Huey Newton from the Alameda County jail, for the April 23, stop the draft week demonstrations in Oakland.

"It appears that the efforts to suppress the will of the black community is intensifying. Every black man who attempts to enlighten the black masses is subversively silenced by the Establishment. This subversion does not occur in the classical shadows of secrecy, but instead it appears openly, wearing the disguise of law and order.

It now becomes incumbent upon those of us who are aware of this covert conspiracy to bring it to the attention of those who are being deceived. We must make the masses of the people aware that the order that is being maintained is that political-economicsocial order of the status quo that allows the present power elite to continue to control the destiny of black people. The laws that are presently in existence were established with that type of order in mind. The laws that deal with human equality and social justice have been subordinated, and that order that refers to the condition of domestic and public tranquility have become secondary."



# Peking Builds Largest Tanzania Textile Mill

DAR ES SALAAM, Africa —
(TNS) — "Bridgebead" and
"Foothold" are two of the favorite words used (especially
in American parlance) to describe the Chinese penetration
into Tanzania. Each new arrival from Peking, whether a
group of doctors for the bushland or surveyors for a promled railway link to Zambia is
chronocled as further evidence
of the "Yellow Peril." of the "Yellow Penl."

of the "Yellow Peril."

This type of catalogue usually omits the fact that there are more Canadians than Chinese in Tanzana, and if you totalled all the Western "experts," advisors, teachers, diplomats and missionaries, the Chinese are outsumbered. the Chinese are outnumbered

Nevertheless to a Western world that is conditioned to see nothing but, evil emanating from China, the Chinese presence here can be made to look world woonaring.

presence here can be made to look pretty menacing.

But a look at the large new lexible mill completely built and financed by China, which was opened recently by President Nyerere is a revelation of just how appropriate and how influential some forms of Chinese aid can be.

As fexible factories on the

Chinese aid can be.

As fextile factories go, the Friendship Mall on the outskirts of Dar es Salaam is perchably very ordinary and not loo different from sponning, we a ving and dyeing milicance is that it is here. Tanzania has for several years been a large producer of raw cotton, but it has always been shipped overseas for processing to be brought back as familied clothing at many times the cost.

Their own cotion being turned into their own clothing, especially the brightly colored shawls called "khangas", which are the basic female garments for most of the population. But any textile mill could do that.

Although the Chinese mill is the largest and the first integrated complex that can also print designs on cotion as well

print designs on cotton as well as weave and dye it, it is not the first nor the only textile mill here.

mill here.

Why, then, is the Friendship
Mill so different?

Stories abound about Communist aid projects in the developing world that are badly
designed and hurriedly built
which have turned out to be
useless.

useless.

But this mill began production 18 months after the cornerstone was laid. Throughout this period, when China was apparently in chaos because of the cultural revolution, every shipment for the project arrived on sich e du Fe. right, down to the fluorescent light bulbs.

Nor is the machinery second-hand or jerry-built. It is all new with metric markets.

Nor is the machinery second-hand or jerry-bail. It is all new, with metric markings in Chinese and English and there is provision for quality control checks at every step. The Chinese knew enough about the climate to provide for air-conditioning and lumidity controlled areas.

Scendly the machinery is co-ier to understand and re-

pair. Because any particular process is broken down into more steps than in an auto-mated mill, it serve a valuable educational function in a pop-ulation where large numbers have never opened a door latch or threaded a nut.

Since the days of the "spin-ning jenny." Lextile's have been the first form of indus-trialization and so it is a very appropriate beginning for a country like Tanzania.

But it is not the technical functioning of the mill that is so impressive because it is probably a standard export model.

Rather, it is the internal or-ganization. The essential thing is that Tanzanians have been left to make the decisions themselves and consequently they are learning from their own mistakes.

Compare this with the traditional system of investment in developing countries. All the executive personnel are foreigners while the local population provides cheap labor and raw materials. As long as there is a foreign financial interest that will be a white manager whereas the manager of the Friendship Mill is black from "day one."

By the same token, the Friendship Mill is black from "day one."

By the same token, the Friendship Mill is owned by Tanzania from the beganning, thoust with an interest free loant wherean the traditional capitalist investor is allowed to send his profits out of the Country, adding to the foreign exchange groblems.

somel manager boasted that there is a Tanzanian under-stodying every Chinese work-man at the mill.

The Chinese actually getting their hands dirty demon-strates the basic difference between the Western and Eastern styles of giving for-cign aid. When the Chinese come, they bring not only their engineers and techni-cians but also their own plumbers, carpenters, cooks, drivers and laborers.

when a Western company undertakes a project it only sends supervisory personnel. What political and social impact will the presence of the Chinese make on Tanzanians, or in Reader's Digest sentiments, will the Chinese win the battle for their hearts and minds? and minds?

Just as I was leaving the mill, a group of Chinese girls were lining up for lunch. Their square-cut hair, bra-less ligures and baggy trousers were marked contrast to the Tranzanian girls, who love the bright colors they are beloing to produce and who use newly I oun d Joundation garments and hair styles to best advantage.

tage.

I doubt if they will be very anxious to emulate their Chinese sisters. President Nyerere himself has often said that his people are not prepared to accept the regimentation of the Chinese way of life.

But Chinese projects such as this will continue to be attractive to the African leaders, who see the Chinese actually demonstrating the devo-tion, hard work and frugality which the chinese actually are in nec-

# **OPEN LETTER** TO A BROTHER **GONE ASTRAY**



Dear Brother,

I will refrain from using your name to avoid being guilty of actions that I am about to criticize. In your publication you have accused Eldridge Cleaver of being a "Brother Tom" -such is not the case. Rather than deal with generalities, I will attempt to do a critical analysis of your accusation.

You say that Eldridge is providing the power maintaining a police state, and therefore, needs but Eldridge has outfoxed them. no excuse. Eldridge is fighting to eliminate subject the power structure to a political consequence for its improper actions.

You say that Eldridge is willing to form premature alliances with groups that do not share we will be abandoned once the other groups justice everywhere." To institute justice we have achieved their goals. Any alliance that accelerates the Black liberation movement towards its goal should be considered a wise alliance, and so far all of the alliances that Eldridge has made have accelerated the movement. We should not be concerned about being abandoned if in the course of an alliance we make progress. I will use an analogy to elucidate my point. It would be foolish for a hitchhiker who was going from Los Angeles to New York to refuse a ride with a man who was going to Kansas City simply because the man was not going all the way to New York.

Our Minister of Information, Eldridge Cleaver, has said that it is time to intensify the struggle. I am in complete agreement with him. Our struggle must be intensified and concentrated to the point that we are so effective and efficient that Black Liberation becomes an inevitability instead of a goal. We must concentrate our efforts on goals that are visible and tangible, so that the people can see and feel the effects of our victories.

Two goals that I intend to give primary attention to are freedom for Huey P. Newton and amnesty for Eldridge Cleaver. These two brothers have given their freedom to us and we must employ that freedom to secure liberty for them. When Huey is free and Eldridge is able to walk the streets without concern for the racist establishment, the people will know that the philosophy of the Panther is a proper and effective one and will join us in our endeavors to secure Black Liberation and world peace. When we have consolidated the will of the people no force on the face of the Earth can stop us because we are the vanguard of the people's will. We have the verbal and spiritual support of the people. But we must gain their physical and active support by

We must expose ourselves in order to give our Black brother a visible organization with which he can associate. The real proof of the pudding lies in the fact that in spite of, or because of, constant exposure and attempted liquidations of the Black Panther Party has grown larger and stronger. Eldridge has been responsible for a great deal of this growth.

In addition to disagreeing with your criticism of Eldridge, I also disagree with your method of doing so. If you really wanted to make some constructive criticisms you could have written directly to Eldridge instead of making a published and public display of Black disunity. Remember what Brother Malcolm said about us discussing our differences in a closet.

I may have violated my own principles by seeking publication of this letter, but I have taken certain precautions. I have used neither your name nor the name of your publication, so only those of us who have read your article and this letter will know to whom my criticism is directed. I think this is much better than making an ineffective statement like, "This letter is for Black people only." I hope that I have offended you in no way because I seek fellowship with all of my black brothers, and I try to criticize actions and not people. I learned this from the Black Panther Party.

### 10 POINT PROGRAM AND PLATFORM OF THE BLACK STUDENT UNIONS

We want an education for our people that exposes the true nature of this decadent American society. We want an education that teaches us our true history and role in the present day society.

We believe in an educational system that will give our people a knowledge of self. If a man does not have knowledge of himself and his position in society and the world, then he has little chance to relate to anything else.

1. WE WANT FREEDOM, WE WANT POWER TO DETERMINE THE DESTINY OF OUR SCHOOL.

We believe that we will not be free within the schools to get a decent education unless we are able to have a say and determine the type of education that will affect and determine the destiny of our people.

2. WE WANT FULL ENROLLMENT IN THE SCHOOLS FOR OUR PEOPLE.

We believe that the city and federal government is responsible and obligated to give every man a decent education.

WE WANT AN END TO THE ROBBERY BY THE WHITE MAN OF OUR BLACK COMMUNITY.

We believe that this racist government has robbed us of an education. We believe that this racist capitalist government has robbed the Black Community of its money by forcing us to pay higher taxes for less quality.

WE WANT DECENT EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES, FIT FOR THE USE OF STUDENTS

We believe that if these businessmen will not give decent facilities to our community schools, then the schools and their facilities should be taken out of the hands of these few individual racists and placed into the hands of the community, with government aid, so the community can develop a decent and suitable educational system.

5. WE WANT AN EDUCATION FOR OUR PEOPLE THAT TEACHES US HOW TO SURVIVE IN THE PRESENT DAY SOCIETY.

We believe that if the educational system does not teach us how to survive in society and the world it loses its meaning for existence.

6. WE WANT ALL RACIST TEACHERS TO BE EXCLUDED AND RESTRICTED FROM ALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

We believe that if the teacher in a school is acting in racist fashion then that teacher is not interested in the welfare or development of the students but only in their destruction.

7. WE WANT AN IMMEDIATE END TO POLICE BRUTALITY AND MURDER OF BLACK PEOPLE. WE WANT ALL POLICE AND SPECIAL AGENTS TO BE EXCLUDED AND RESTRICTED FROM SCHOOL PREMISES.

We believe that there should be an end to harasment by the police department of Black people. We believe that if all of the police were pulled out of the schools, the schools would become more functional.

WE WANT ALL STUDENTS THAT HAVE BEEN EXEMPT. EXPELLED, OR SUSPENDED FROM SCHOOL TO BE REINSTATED.

We believe all students should be reinstated because they haven't received fair and impartial judgment or have been put out because of incidents or situations that have occured outside of the schools authority.

WE WANT ALL STUDENTS WHEN BROUGHT TO TRIAL TO BE TRIED IN STUDENT COURT BY A JURY OF THEIR PEER GROUP OR STUDENTS OF THEIR SCHOOL.

We believe that the student courts should follow the United States Constitution so that students can receive a fair trial. The 14th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution gives a man a right to be tried by a jury of his peer group. A peer is a person from a similar economical, social, religious, geographical, environmental, historical and racial background. To do this the court would be forced to select a jury of students from the community from which the defendent came. We have been and are being tried by a white principal, vice-principal, and white students that have no understanding of the "average reasoning man" of the Black Community.

WE WANT POWER, ENROLLMENT, EQUIPMENT, EDUCATION, TEACHERS, JUSTICE, AND PEACE.

As our major political objective, an assembly for the student body, in which only the students will be allowed to participate, for the purpose of determining the will of the students as to the school's destiny.

We hold these truths as being self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their creator with certain inalicable rights, that among these are tife, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. To secure these rights within the schools, governments are instituted among the students, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, that whenever any form of student government becomes destructive to these ends, it is the right of the students to alter or abolish it and to institute new government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its power in such form as to them shall seem most likely to effect their safety and happiness.

Prudence, indeed, will dictate that governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes, and accordingly all experiences hive shown, that mankind are more liable to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of abuses and force, pursuing invariably the same object, reveals a design to reduce them to absolute destruction, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such a government and to provide new guards for their future accurate.

# **SIGN PETITION: CONTROL YOUR LOCAL PIGS**

The Black Panther Party is circulating petitions in the cities of Berkeley, Oakland and Richmond, California, to gain community control of the police. The Black Panther Party is going to use the power of referendum to put an end to the police brutality that has flourished in the East Bay cities. By signing the petitions the registered voters in the cities of Berkeley, Oakland and Richmond ean bring the matter of community control of the police before the


people, the voters.

The basis for community control of the police is derived from the political philosophy that espouses that to secure the rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, "governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed," This philosophy can be applied by the people of the various communities of the East Bay to gain control of the enforcement branch of the city government. Since governments derive their power from the consent of the governed, it would be unjust for any oppressive force to be applied to a community to force that community to submit to an undesired form of governmental power. Each community must be given the autonomy it needs to pursue its happiness and desired order. If the will of the majority is used to suppress the rights of a minority, the resulting order will be unjust.

The present system of centralized police administration and control forces an unjust order onto the minorities by forcing the minorities to submit unwillingly to a type of enforcement that is repugnant to them. As long as an unjust order is imposed there will be many just men punished by that order. Huey P. Newton's imprisonment is a case in point. The only means for protecting the dignity and humanity of the just is to subject them only to a just system. A just system demands that each community has the power to control its destiny and maintain its tran-quility. The petitions for community control of police is a measure that will help to balance the scales of justice.

Basically, the proposed amendments will establish separate police departments for the predominantly Black districts and the predominantly white districts of each city. (A third department will be established in Berkeley for the student communities.) The departments will be separate and autonomous, but they may by mutual agreement use common facilities. Each department will be administered by full time police commissions. The commissioners are to be selected by a Neighborhood Police Control Council composed of elected members from the local community. The councils shall have the power to discipline officers for breaches of Department policy or violations of law. The councils may also direct their commissioners to make changes in department-wide policy by majority vote. The amendment will also require all police officers to live in the department where they work.

Police brutality will cease when police are made to answer to the community for their brutal and oppressive tactics. In the name of justice, be sure to sign the petition.

### POCKET LAWYER OF LEGAL FIRST AID

This pocket lawyer is provided as a means of keeping black people up to date on their rights. We are always the first to be arrested and the racist police forces are constantly trying to pretend that rights are extended equally to all people. Cut this out, brothers and sisters, and carry it with you. Until we arm ourselves to righteously take care of our own, the pocket lawyer is what's

1. If you are stopped and/or arrested by the police, you may re silent; you do not have to answer any questions about al-crimes, you should provide your name and address only if leged crimes. requested (although it is not absolutely clear that you must do so.) But then do so, and at all time remember the fifth amendment.

2. If a police officer is not in uniform, ask him to show his identification. He has no authority over you unless he properly identi-fies himself. Beware of persons posing as police officers. Always get his badge number and his name.

 Police have no right to search your car or your home unless they have a search warrant, probable cause or your consent. They may conduct no exploratory search, that is, one for evidence of crime generally or for evidence of a crime unconnected with the one you are being questioned about. (Thus, a stop for an auto violation does not give the right to search the auto.) You are not required to consent to a search; therefore, you should not consent and should state clearly and unequivocally that you do not consent, in front of witnesses if possible. If you do not consent, the police will have the burden in court of showing probably cause. Arrest may be corrected later.

 You may not resist arrest forcibly or by going limp, even if you are innocent. To do so is a separate crime of which you can be convicted even if you are acquitted of the original charge. Do not resist arrest under any circumstances.

If you are stopped and/or arrested, the police may search you by patting you on the outside of your clothing. You can be stripped your personal possessions. Do not carry anything that includes

the name of your employer or friends.

7. Do not engage in "friendly" conversation with officers on the way to or at the station. Once you are arrested, there is little like-lihood that anything you say will get you released.

8. As soon as you have been booked, you have the right to com-

plete at least two phone calls—one to a relative, friend or attorney, the other to a bail bondsman. If you can, call the Black Panther Party, 845-0103 (845-0104), and the Party will post bail if possible

You must be allowed to hire and see an attorney immediately. 10. You do not have to give any statement to the police, nor do you have to sign any statement you might give them, and therefore you should not sign anything. Take the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments, because you cannot be forced to testify against

yourself.

You must be allowed to post bail in most cases, but you must be able to pay the bail bandsmen's fee. If you cannot pay the fee, you may ask the judge to release you from custody without bail or to lower your bail, but he does not have to do so.

12. The police must bring you into court or release you within 48 hours after your arrest (unless the time e?ds on a week-end or a holiday, and they must bring you before a judge the first day court

13. If you do no' have the money to hire an attorney, immediately ask the police to get you an attorney without charge.

14. If you have the money to hire a private attorney, but do not know of one, call the National Lawyers' Guild or the Alameda County Bar Association (or the Bar Association of your county) and furnish you with the name of an attorney who practices criminal

## PIGS PLOTTED MURDERS OF L.A. PANTHERS

Why was there a planned attack waged against the filack residence of Watts by the pig police department? Our brothers were murdered, our women and children were viciously, shamelessly, and unmercifully assaulted and beaten by this army of pigs. Those of us who are residents of Watts or for that matter residents of any Black community know that harassment and brutality by the pig is a dully routine. So it is only reasonable logic to conclude that the bosses of the pigs had a definate significant motive for waging this attack. # Panther captain murdered

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 30—Franko Diggs, a captain of the Los Angeles Black Panther Party, was murdered at 120 St. and Main St. on Dec. 19, according to a statement made today by Panther spokesman Mike Pennywell. The murder received no coverage in the local newspapers. A public faneral was planned for 1 p.m., Thursday, Jan. 2, at the Victory Baptist Church, 4802 McKinley Avenue.

In a statement to The Militant Penny.

In a statement to The Militant, Pennywell described the murder of Franko Diggs as "an attempt to liquidate the leadership of the Black Panther Party by the racial power structure. . . Captain Franko had no real family—but he had a big family here in L. A. that loved him very deeply, the Black Panther Party. . . . We will intensify our struggle until there will be no more cold-blooded murders of our people."

When Watson and the other brothers went to be arrainged, the Judge refused to hear or take into evidence any comments made by the people of the black community on behalf of the Panther brothers. Showing us again what kind of injustice can be expected from the pig's court.

obtained two lawyers to investigate and that the slain man's parents also are sending lawyers from Chicago

"I don't think he was rob-

bing (the store) — he was a faithful member of the par-ty," Harris said.

# **DENVER PIGS ATTACK PANTHERS**

The Denver police are imitating storm troopers this month in their attempt to destroy the local Black Panther Party. They have succeeded only in increasing Panther militancy and community support of the

militancy and community support of the group.

On Saturday, Dec. 7, 43 cops raided and ransacked Au Naturel, the Panthers' head-quarters, causing an estimated \$9,000 in damage. The cops had a warrant and claimed they were hot on the trail of a large cache of weapons. Afterwards they reported finding four, guns. Newspapers praised the cops, saying that they had been informed that the arms were moved out just before the raid.

A member of the University of Colorado SDS, an eyewitness to the raid, gave this description: "The pigs ripped off the wood panneling, pulled out light fixtures, tore up posters, smaahed a display of black art.

posters, amashed a display of black art, battered down the walls between the offices and mutilated the faces on drawings hung around the place. They broke into coke and pinball machines and the cash register. and plaball machines and the case register, tore out a stage, smashed chairs, tore up the basement and destroyed boxes of chil-dren's toys the Fanther's had collected for neighborhood kids. The place looked like a bomb-had hit." The Fanthers report that

the cops stole \$137 from the cash register and \$20 from the coke machine.

The raid took place just after 100 guests left Au Naturel. They had been celebrating the wedding of Panther leader Lauren Watson. Watson had received earlier threats from the police, assuring him that his wed-ding would never happen. An armed Pan-ther guard stood on a halcony throughout

Seaton theorized that the Panthers had done the damage themselves, to tarnish the good reputation of the police department. He said the cops carried out an ordinary search." Mayor Currigan criticized the Pan-

search." Mayor Currigan criticized the Panthers for "doing a great disservice to the community" by "libeling" the cops.

The cops did not limit themselves to destroying property. Earlier on the wedding day they arrested James Young. a Panther leader, claiming that he stood outside the headquarters with a shotgun and "threatened to shoot a cop, then ran back into the house." But Young was busted outside, unarmed. He was charged with "assaudt on the house." But Young was busted outside, unarmed. He was charged with "assault on a police officer" and locked up for two days in Denver County jail. At the time of the arrest Young was out on bond from a previous charge of sniping during an outbreak in Denver's black community last summer. The cops roughed up Young's wife and charged her with "creating a disturbance." It is reported that this charge has been dropped.

Lauren Watson was also arrested last summer and charged with "conspiracy to commit arson." His trial started Dec. 16, and if he is found guilty, he can be sentenced to a maximum of 20 years in jail. Several other Panthers have been followed and busted on technical traffic violations, such as not stopping behind the white

SEATTLE-Aaron Dixon, Seattle Black Panther Party captain, won a major court victory on Dec. 17. He had been tried on a trumped-up charge of grand larceny by possession because an allegedly stolen typewriter was found in Black Panther headquarters. After less than four hours of deliberation an all-white jury of 10 women and two men returned a verdict of not guilty. The trial was part of a concerted police drive against the Panthers.

The prosecution maintained that Dixon was seen carrying a typewriter into the Panther office on the evening of July 18, 1968, the same evening a typewriter had disappeared from the Legal Services Center about a mile away. The missing typewriter was found at Panther headquarkers on July 29, when the policy entered and exceeded. 29 when the police entered and searched the office and arrested Aaron Dixon.

The state's case rested mainly on the testimony of Detective Sanford of the Seattle Police Department, who said he observed the Panther office from an unmarked police car on the evening of July 18. On several polists his testimony at the trial contradicted his earlier sworn statements.

He originally indicated behaved asset Divor-

He originally indicated he had seen Dixon enter the headquarters about 9 p.m.; at the trial he testified it was closer to 8 p.m. At the trial he testified for the first time that he had been using binoculars; earlier he had indicated he was simply watching. He also changed the position of the other police officers in the car, and changed

the position of the car itself.

When asked to explain these and the other differences in testimony, Sanford suggested that the official court record of his testimony was incorrect and also that he hadn't read 'word for word' the affidavits he had almost


Two defense witnesses swore that Dixon was at their apartment from 8 p.m. until about 9:20 on July 18. Dixon's mother testified that he had been home between about 9:30 and 10:30.

A series of photographs of the Panther headquarters were introduced as evidence, taken under conditions similar to those which prevailed at the time Detective Sanford said he saw Dixon with the typewriter. The photographs taken from the alleged position of the police car showed numerous obstructions to the view of the Panther headquarters.

A major part of the defense case rested on the testimony of an electrical engineer. On the basis of light meter readings, he testified to the dim light just before sunset on July 18, and other equally important

The sum total of the evidence against the Scattle cops' case was so convincing that even the Superior Court judge com-mended the jury's verdict of not guilty.

The head was rather chunky and formless like a harded clod of earth. Out of the face protruded a deformed grisly nose, like a deat in a piece of sheet metal. The skin was crusted and had a bluish tinge where fungus-like outgrowths of hair hung limply from the ruptured double chin. The forethead was low and narrow, savagely jutting out, and supported by a bushy jungle of spe-like brows. The eyes, recessive and like those of a diseased animal, were held together by blobs of formless flesh. The total conglomeration was high-lighted by a patch of stubble, graying where it met the mutated outgrowths parallel to the nose, called ears. The structure in all its stag-

nant repuisiveness, was mounted on a cringed, broken, decrepted frame, from which thick, hairy, elongated stubs hung like two corpases from a gallows. These were fused at the extremities to two claw-like mechanisms, from which grew mutations of once agile feelers, now lost in a fur-like jungle of coarse insulation. This derelict being was also reinforced by a pair of rubbery, synthetic, boay extensions, kept in balance by two elongated monkey paws, to which crusted, burned callouses clung in tight raw little bunches, thus inhibiting complete freedom of movement. The function of this Pre-Neanderthal monstreaity was to act as guardian of the peace, and protector of law and order.

Eldridge Cleaver anade the decision to politically exile himself November 27th, on the basis that the Adult Authority made an outlaw decision, and that he has been dealed his constitutional right to due process of law.

The resocation of Cleaver's parole we illegal, because no parole violation was committed.

The Adult Authority purole board has fared to maintain that Cleaver violated his parole by having a rifle in his possession, and by associating with individuals of bad reputation. This contention, we will show, is false. The Adult Authority version contradicts the Superior Court order itself:

"... Cleaver's only handling of a firearm (the rifle) was in obedience to a police command. He did not handle a hand gun at all. There was nothing one way or the other to show a conspiracy or a situation calling for the application of the doctrine of aiding and abetting. Hence, nothing supported either the possession of a firearm or the assault charge.

As to the charge of association with individuals of bad reputation, the report indicated that two or three of those named had "police records," but nothing to show whether any had been convicted of anything, or whether Cleaver knew of their arrest record." (Superior Court c.t. 137, 138, 140, 111)

Parolee Cleaver was denied due process of law by being denied opportunity to present his case.

Why was Cleaver returned to prison as a parole violator if documented evidence to the contrary had been presented in his defense? To answer that question, one must examine the Adult Authority. This board has the right to arbitrarily revoke or suspend parole on any individual. At the same time, the Adult Authority maintains—falsely—that Cleaver has the opportunity to defend himself at a hearing. This is how it works:

"A parolee is served with violation charges, is interviewed, is given a hearing (before the Adult Authority itself, the charging party) at which the parolee may 'plead' to the parole violation charges, and is afforded an opportunity to present his defense."

"At the 'hearing' a parolee is denied the right to counsel, may not have an independent and impartial officer to conduct the hearing and make decision." (Petition for Hearing in the Supreme Court, p. 17)

Not only does the Adult Authority hold secret hearings, but it also refuses to notify persons under its jurisdiction of its procedures, or of its variable definitions of what constitutes a parole violation. This secrecy and vagueness is in direct violation of federal law which requires agencies to publish their procedures "for guidance of the public."

"Petitioner (Cleaver) is immediately and seriously prejudiced by the Adult Authority's unlawful refusal to publish its regulations, since he is to be imprisoned by virtue of an action which the Adult Authority still seek-to garb in this 'veil of secrecy.' (Petition for Hearing in the Supreme Court, 12)

Yes, the Adult Authority acted usuastly and illegally, its decision was an outlaw decision. Cleaver had no chance of obtaining "postice" from these Star Chamber proceedings. Why then wouldn't the U.S. Supremetous four Cleaver's case. There are, we believe, three reasons why tiscose won't accepted. The first is that any fair minded count would obspace believe released Cleaver, thereby setting a precedent. The second is that thousands of cases of alleged parole violation from all over California and other states would be subject to reversal. Thirdly, the illeged functioning of the Adult Authority would come under attack. The U.S. Supreme Court just couldn't afford to consider the Cleaver case during this turbulent period.

Eldridge Cleaver is a victim of naked, shameless political personation. As Judge Sherwin puts it:

The uncontradicted evidence presented to this court indicated that the petitioner had been a model puroles. The pivil to his parole status stemmed from no failure of personal reliabilitation, but from his anchor elemence in pursuing political goals, reals which were offensive to many of

his contemporaries. Not only was there absence of cause for the cancellation of parole, it was the product of a type of pressure unbecoming, to say the least, to the law enforcement paraphernalia of this state."

Cleaver is in political exile because a man of his convictious cannot get justice here. Indeed, if we are to give more than lip service to the concepts of freedom and justice we must support him. The work to get him discharged from parole must continue. An intense publicity campaign is necessary now to bring to the public the legal defense and arguments which were carried to the courts with no satisfaction. We must all work together to focus attention of this case. This is not an issue of one mun's freedom, but a broad struggle which affirms the right of all of us to speak out politically in this country. If Cleaver is not allowed his freedom, it is just a matter of time notil all our freedoms are further reduced. His is not a personal struggle but a political one.

### WHAT WE WANT

#### WHAT WE BELIEVE



1. We want freedom. We want power to determine the destiny of our Black Community.

We believe that black people will not be free until we are able to determine our destiny.

### 2. We want full employment for our people.

We believe that the federal government is responsible and obligated to give every man employment or a guaranteed income. We believe that if the white American businessmen will not give full employment, then the means of production should be taken from the businessmen and placed in the community so that the people of the community can organize and employ all of its people and give a high standard of living.

#### We want an end to the robbery by the white man of our Black Community.

We believe that this racist government has robbed us and now we are demanding the overdue debt of forty acres and two mules. Forty acres and two mules was promised 100 years ago as restitution for slave labor and mass murder of black people. We will accept the payment in currency which will be distributed to our many communities. The Germans are now aiding the Jews in Israel for the genocide of the Jewish people. The Germans murdered six million Jews. The American racist has taken part in the slaughter of over fifty million black people; therefore, we feel that this is a modest demand that we make.

### 4. We want decent housing, fit for shelter of human beings.

We believe that if the white landlords will not give decent housing to our black community, then the housing and the land should be made into cooperatives so that our community, with government aid, can build and make decent housing for its people.

#### We want education for our people that exposes the true nature of this decadent American society. We want education that teaches us our true history and our role in the present-day society.

We believe in an educational system that will give to our people a knowledge of self. If a man does not have knowledge of himself and his position in society and the world, then he has little chance to relate to anything else.

### 8. We want all black men to be exempt from military service.

We believe that Black people should not be forced to fight in the military service to defend a racist government that does not protect us. We will not fight and kill other people of color in the world who, like black people, are being victimized by the white racist government of America. We will protect ourselves from the force and violence of the racist police and the racist military, by whatever means necessary.





 We want an immediate end to POLICE BRUTALITY and MURDER of black people.

We believe we can end police brutality in our black community by organizing black self-defense groups that are dedicated to defending our black community from racist police oppression and brutality. The Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States gives a right to bear arms. We therefore believe that all black people should arm themselves for self defense.

### We want freedom for all black men held in federal, state, county and city prisons and jails.

We believe that all black people should be released from the many jails and prisons because they have not received a fair and impartial trial.


#### We want all black people when brought to trial to be tried in court by a jury of their peer group or people from their black communities, as defined by the Constitution of the United States.

We believe that the courts should follow the United States Constitution so that black people will receive fair trials. The 14th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution gives a man a right to be tried by his peer group. A peer is a person from a similar economic, social, religious, geographical, environmental, historical and racial background. To do this the court will be forced to select a jury from the black community from which the black defendant came. We have been, and are being tried by all-white juries that have no understanding of the "average reasoning man" of the black community.

10. We want land, bread, housing, education, clothing, justice and peace. And as our major political objective, a United Nations-supervised plebiscite to be held throughout the black colony in which only black colonial subjects will be allowed to participate, for the purpose of determining the will of black people as to their national destiny.

When, in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume, among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the laws of nature and nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. That, to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed; that, whenever any form of government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the right of the people to alter or to abolish it, and to institute a new government, laying its foundation on such principles, and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their safety and happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and, accordingly, all experience hath shown, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But, when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same object, evinces a design or reduce them under absolute despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such government, and to provide new guards for their future security.

### RULES OF THE BLACK PANTHER PARTY

CENTRAL HEADQUARTERS OAKLAND, CALIFORNIA ...

Every member of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY throughout this country of racist America must abide by these rules as functional members of this party. CENTRAL COMMITTEE members, CENTRAL STAFFS, and LOCAL STAFFS, including all captains subordinate to either national, state, and local leadership of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY will enforce these rules. Length of suspension or other disciplinary action necessary for violation of these rules will depend on national decisions by national, state or state area, and local committees and staffs where said rule or rules of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY WERE VIOLATED. WERE VIOLATED.

Every member of the party must know these verbatum by beart. And apply them daily. Each member must report any violation of these rules to their leadership or they are counter-revolutionary and are also subjected to suspension by the BLACK PANTHER PARTY.

#### THE RULES ARE:

- No party member can have narcotics or weed in his possession while doing party work.
- 2. Any party member found shooting narcotics will be expelled from
- this party.

  3. No party member can be DRUNK while doing daily party work.

  4. No party member will violate rules relating to office work, general meetings of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY, and meetings of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY ANYWHERE.
  5. No party member will USE, POINT, or FIRE a weapon of any kind unnecessarily or accidentally at anyone.
  6. No party member can join any other army force other than the BLACK LIBERATION ARMY.

- 7. No party member can have a weapon in his possession while DRUNK or loaded off narcotics or weed,
  8. No party member will commit any crimes against other party members or BLACK people at all, and cannot steal or take from the
- ople, not even a needle or a piece of thread.

  9. When arrested BLACK PANTHER MEMBERS will give only name, address, and will sign nothing. Legal first aid must be understood
- 10. The Ten Point Program and platform of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY must be known and understood by each Party member.

  11. Party Communications must be National and Local.

  12. The 10-10-10-program should be known by all members and

  13. All Finance officers will operate under the jurisdiction of the
- Ministry of Finance

  14. Each person will submit a report of daily work.

  15. Each Sub-Section Leaders, Section Leaders, and Lieutenants, Captains must submit Daily reports of work.

  16. All Panthers must learn to operate and service weapons correctly.

  17. All Leadership personnel who expel a member must submit this information to the Editor of the Newspaper, so that it will be published in the paper and will be known by all chapters and branches.

  18. Political Education Classes are mandatory for general membership.

  19. Only office personnel assigned to respective offices each day should be there. All others are to sell papers and do Political work out in the community, including Captains, Section Leaders, etc.

  20. COMMUNICATIONS all chapters must submit weekly reports in writing to the National Headquarters.

  21. All Branches must implement First Aid and/or Medical Cadres.

  22. All Chapters, Branches, and components of the BLACK PAN-THER PARTY must submit a monthly Financial Report to the Ministry of Finance, and also the Central Committee.

  23. Everyone in a leadership position must read no less than two hours per day to keep abreast of the changing political situation.

  24. No chapter or branch shall accept grants, poverty funds, money or any other aid from any government agency without contacting the National Headquarters.

  25. All chapters must adhere to the policy and the ideology laid down by the CENTRAL COMMITTEE of the BLACK PANTHER PARTY
- 26. All Branches must submit weekly reports in writing to their respective Chapters.


