"It certainly gives us a fine opportunity to get the subs with this new sub-card idea, "says one of the comrades who came in with thirty-five nice ones, representing a week's work. "I found the great atumbling-block in getting them due to the average working man not feeling that he could dispense with one whole dollar for a sub eard, but when you approach him with a three month's card at 25 cents, he is willing to take one."

Let every contrade, from now on until we reach a circulation well up in the thousands, try and do what this comrade did.

There is just one cause that prevents the getting of subs, and that is yourself. We'll wager that the subscription list would soar upward like a condor does preparatory to his attack, if you would take as much interest in the selling of sub cards as you do in some of the other

things.

For instance, supposing you would simply make up your mind that you are going to sell just so many cards each week, no matter if you made many useless attempts, but continued to stick until you get a certain amount, and if the other conrades would do likewise, why, there would be nothing to prevent the coming in of subs.

But do you do this? We bet you never think of making it part of your duty, just like getting up in the morning and going to your factory at the call of the whistle, and doing a certain amount of work to perpetuate capitalism.
